Never mind that the media is repeating what they did when he was running for president four years ago, but clearly the "establishment" is absolutely freaking out about Dr. Ron Paul's recent surge in the polls. This is no big surprise since this is exactly what they did months ago when he placed second and just a few votes behind Michelle Bachmann when the press completely ignored him and then proceeded to elevate those that came in far behind him. **Here is why I don't believe Ron Paul wrote that racial stuff in those newsletters from 22 years ago...**
